During July our hymnist of note is Issac Watts (1674-1748.) Issac was a brilliant student learning Latin when he was only four so that he could memorize poems in another language. Issac knew five different languages by the time he was a young teenager. Issac's father was a preacher who encouraged his son to write hymns to sing at their church after Issac expressed distaste for the hymns that were being sung. He was only fifteen when he began writing hymns that are still being sung today.
