Reginald Heber was born to a minister and his wife in an English village on April 21, 1783. After a happy childhood, he received an excellent education in his village school and went on to study at Oxford excelling in poetry and becoming a close friend of Sir Walter Scott. Following graduation he succeeded his father as vicar in his family's parish serving for 16 years. It was during these years that Heber wrote all 57 of his hymns. Reginald had a heart for missions and in 1822 at age 40 he was appointed to oversee the Church of England's ministries in India. He died suddenly in India four years later. His poems were published after his death by his widow.
