

Responsive Reading Westminster Shorter Catechism, Q&A 57-59

Leader: What is the fourth commandment?

People: The fourth commandment is: Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the Lord your God. On it you shall not do any work, neither you, nor your son or daughter, nor your manservant or maidservant, nor your animals, nor the alien within your gates. For in six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but he rested on the seventh day. Therefore the Lord blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy.

Leader: What does the fourth commandment require?

People: The fourth commandment requires us to set apart to God the times He has established in His word-specifically one whole day out of every seven as a holy Sabbath to Him.

Leader: Which day of the week has God designated as the Sabbath?

People: From the beginning of the world until the resurrection of Christ, God established the seventh day of the week as the Sabbath. From that time until the end of the world the first day of the week is the Christian Sabbath.

Almighty God, you have raised Jesus from death to life and crowned him Lord of all. We confess that we have not bowed before him or
